I have been a member of the City Livery Club and the Bishopsgate Ward Club for over 25 years and have recently joined the Royal Society of St. George, City of London Branch.

Ten years ago I became involved in the management of the Ranyard Memorial Nursing Home becoming a Trustee and, in 1989, Chairman.

My wife, Ella, has involved herself in both years when I have been Master and wholeheartedly supports me. She retires this summer after fourteen years teaching in a Wimbledon nursery school. Ella has also been Chairman of the Wimbledon Committee of the Children's Society for four years and sits on their central appeals body. Our two sons and two daughters are grown up and pursuing their own careers but happily support our interests.
